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Growing up, I saw my parents practice philanthropy and help our community in many different ways. During the '70s and '80s, for instance, there were multiple people who were in need of education, housing, and other care living in our house. In addition to taking care of my brothers and me, my parents used the little income they had to take care of them, including paying for their school fees.

These philanthropic values that were instilled in me from early on are what eventually led to the founding of SEOF. The Foundation is built on the principle of giving back, and we have demonstrated our commitment over the years to supporting and empowering communities, including our home community, Oraifite, Anambra State. We have done this through

targeted programs and projects that focus on addressing fundamental needs and impacting lives sustainably.

We focus on programs that sustainably impact the lives of people in communities across Nigeria. This ethos has seen us invest in Healthcare, Education and Socio-Economic Empowerment.

SEOF recognizes that facilitating sustainable community development is essential for creating long-lasting change. The Foundation has adopted a communitydriven approach to its development initiatives that emphasizes working closely with community members to identify their needs and develop solutions that address their unique challenges. By involving community members in the planning and implementation of projects, we ensure that the initiatives are tailored to meet the specific needs of the community. Moreover, we provide training and capacitybuilding programs to empower community members to take ownership of the projects and sustain them beyond the Foundation's support. Through this approach, we foster a sense of community ownership and pride in these projects, leading to greater impact and long-term sustainability.

Healthcare



Since the Foundation's inception, we have provided free medical care for underserved communities through medical missions, health fairs, and sponsorship of individual medical procedures in Nigeria and overseas.

In 2020, we officially partnered with the Vincent Ohaju Obioma Memorial (VOOM) Foundation, a Texas-based foundation made up of volunteer doctors, nurses, health workers, and other support professions that has a sustainable and lifesaving open-heart surgery program in Nigeria. This partnership has provided both subsidized and free-of-charge healthcare services to over 4,000 beneficiaries from all

over Nigeria to date. In 2022, we finished building and commissioned the Dame Irene Okwuosa Memorial Hospital (DIOMH) in Oraifite, Anambra State.

Phase I of the Hospital project was the establishment of a world-class, fullyequipped hospital with a specialty in cardiovascular surgeries and interventions capable of delivering equitable, high-quality medical treatment. The Hospital is complete with a 64-slice CT scan, the latest Cath lab, 4D Ultrasound Scan machine, and ICU Machines with ventilators. The Hospital also produces its own medical gas, contributing to the sustainability of the project. Phase II of the Hospital project launched in 2023 with the creation of a Primary Health Care (PHC) center built out of repurposed shipping containers. This PHC was designed by students at Texas A&M University in partnership with other organizations and adapted by engineers at Frazimex Engineering Limited in Nigeria to cater to DIOMH's specific needs. The PHC is an indigenized solution to Primary Health Care challenges in Nigeria.

In 2022 alone, over 32 open-heart surgeries were performed at DIOMH, including on a 9month-old infant, which accounts for around 15% of the total number of open-heart surgeries carried out by all the hospitals in Nigeria combined during the year.





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Education



School level through our scholarship program, annual prize-giving ceremony, and the provision of high-quality educational tools. Hundreds more students at the Primary School level and University level have also benefited from our scholarship program over the years.

In 2019, we finished building and donated an All-Girls Secondary School - The Dame Irene Okwuosa Memorial Convent (DIOMECO), in Oraifite, Anambra State, to The Anglican Diocese. The 600-student capacity school, which is home to girls from all over Nigeria, affords young girls access to



quality education in a constantly evolving and increasingly competitive world. The modern school complex has many amenities, including an ICT room, a fully equipped library, an integrated studio and learning hub, a laboratory, an art studio, and medical and sports rooms.

To support the goal of gender equality, we have also organized career workshops and symposiums that introduced girls to career paths in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM).







We have scaled a new form of economic development by collaborating with local universities, education think-tanks, and VTE institutions in offering skills-based training and connecting students in two Tertiary Institutions in the South East & South South with future-focused opportunities and informal careers.

In 2024, we plan to launch our first National Engineering Competition Award aimed at identifying outstanding engineering students who have been working on innovative prototypes with real-world applications. The Competition is designed to encourage engineers and would-be engineers to work towards collectively solving Nigeria's pressing challenges with the aim of expanding the Competition across the continent in future years.









Socio-Economic Empowerment



e believe that sustainable socio-economic empowerment should be centered around providing market-facing skills and opportunities, particularly to the youth, who constitute the majority of the Nigerian and African population. Our goal is to teach beneficiaries how to "fish" so they can feed themselves and their communities for a lifetime.

Over the years, we have been involved in several socioeconomic initiatives in communities across Nigeria. Notable projects include the building of a garri processing factory and the donation of motorcycles to assist small business owners with their transportation businesses. These programs have had a sustained and positive



economic impact on the lives of our beneficiaries by providing employment and other opportunities.

In 2024, we plan to roll out several new programs:

Women Enterprise Program – This impact investment program aims to support women entrepreneurs in scaling up their businesses through skill-building workshops, mentoring and networking opportunities, and access to funding and markets within their chosen sector.

Agro Cluster Cooperative Program – This agricultural program will provide jobs and enhance food security not only locally but across the country by giving farmers access to inputs and guaranteed off-take as a catalyst for more robust farming.
