




In the heart of Kogi state, Mopelola's Adeyemi Olabuju's world was forever changed when her 3-month-old son Prevail was diagnosed with Tetralogy of Fallot (TOF), a life-threatening heart condition that stops the flow of oxygen in the heart. For months, she navigated the emotional and financial struggles that came with seeking medical help for her precious child. What makes this story even more remarkable is that the beacon of hope came from an unexpected source—the Sir Emeka Okwuosa Foundation, which played a pivotal role in sponsoring the open-heart surgery that became the turning point in the young child's life.

The journey began with Mopelola's unwavering love for her son. When Prevail was just three months old, the family received the heartbreaking news of his heart condition. Desperate to find help, the mother tirelessly sought assistance from various sources, facing numerous dead ends and financial barriers.

In the age of connectivity, social media emerged as an unexpected ally. Through the vast network of Facebook, the family stumbled upon the Sir Emeka Okwuosa Foundation. Skeptical but hopeful, they explored the foundation's mission and impact, which led to a significant life changing event.


Hailing from Kogi state, Mopelola's family harboured reservations about reaching out to a foundation based in the South East for help. The prevailing stereotypes and historical divisions in Nigeria often cast shadows on intertribal cooperation. However, the Sir Emeka Okwuosa Foundation shattered these misconceptions by extending a helping hand to a family in need, showcasing that compassion transcends ethnic boundaries.

Impressed by the foundation's commitment to healthcare, the family reached out with a glimmer of hope. To their surprise, the response was swift and compassionate. The Sir Emeka Okwuosa Foundation took charge, ensuring the little warrior received the critical open-heart surgery he desperately needed.

As the now 3-year-old underwent the intricate surgery, the foundation's support became a cornerstone of support. The surgical success marked not only a medical triumph but a testament to the foundation's commitment to making quality healthcare accessible to all, regardless of age, ethnicity, gender or any other distinguishing characteristic.

The impact story rippled through the community, fostering a sense of unity and shared humanity. Neighbors, friends, and family rallied around the family, inspired by the Sir Emeka Okwuosa Foundation's generosity and contribution to breaking down stereotypes.

When Chimsindi Enwelum Victory was just four months old, her parents received heart-wrenching news: their baby girl had been diagnosed with Patent Ductus Arteriosus (PDA), a serious heart condition that was restricting proper blood flow. This condition meant that Chimsindi's heart was struggling to circulate blood effectively, which could lead to further complications as she grew older.

Initially, doctors recommended open heart surgery as the only solution, a terrifying prospect for any parent, especially when the patient is so young. Chimsindi's family was filled with anxiety and uncertainty, facing the possibility of a major, invasive surgery for their beloved daughter.

But the story took a positive turn when Chimsindi's parents sought treatment at the Dame Irene Okwuosa Memorial Hospital, a place known for its innovative approach to complex medical cases. After a thorough evaluation, the team of skilled cardiologists determined that interventional catheterization was a more appropriate option for Chimsindi, offering a far less invasive solution than surgery.

Interventional catheterization involves using a thin tube, called a catheter, which is inserted through a small incision and guided to the heart to close the PDA. The procedure is far less risky than open-heart surgery, involves no chest opening, and requires only a brief recovery time.

On the day of the procedure, Chimsindi's parents were understandably anxious, but the medical team reassured them that this was a safe and effective alternative. The procedure was a success, and within hours, Chimsindi was awake and alert. Miraculously, she was able to go home the very next day, free from the heart condition that had caused her so much

pain and discomfort for the first few months of her life.

Now, at just four years old, Chimsindi is a vibrant, healthy child—running, playing, and enjoying life to the fullest. Her parents are overjoyed to see their daughter thriving, and their relief is immeasurable. What once seemed like an impossible and frightening journey now feels like a miracle, thanks to the intervention at Dame Irene Okwuosa Memorial Hospital.

Chimsindi's story is a powerful reminder of why quality healthcare must be accessible to all—especially innovative alternatives to more invasive procedures like open-heart surgery. Her case highlights the life-changing impact of having access to modern medical techniques, which can not only save lives but also spare families from the physical and emotional toll of more extensive procedures.

This case also underscores the importance of healthcare facilities like Dame Irene Okwuosa Memorial Hospital, where cutting-edge technology and compassionate care come together to offer patients a second chance at life. For Chimsindi and her family, the availability of interventional catheterization made all the difference, allowing her to grow up healthy and happy, without the long recovery or risks associated with surgery.

Chimsindi's story is a testament to the transformative power of accessible, high-quality healthcare and the incredible difference that having the right medical options can make in a child's life.
